Mitigation assessment

The **first webinar** provides an **overview of the key steps to conduct a mitigation assessment** and translate it into a detailed national climate action plan. It aims at enabling participants to obtain a broad but sound understanding of the process.

- Identification of stakeholders, definition of the scope of the assessment, mitigation assessment timeframes, selection of assessment methodologies (marginal abatement cost curves/economic analysis, modelling), baseline scenarios, and screening of potential mitigation options are among the topics that will be discussed.

The **second webinar** will highlight key mitigation challenges and barriers faced in the sectors of energy supply (electricity generation); transport; buildings; industry; agriculture; forestry and waste management and how these are considered in a mitigation assessment.

Mitigation technologies that affect multiple sectors, or that cannot be attributed to any particular sector will also be discussed.
